Dear Chair Capito and Ranking Member Baldwin:

We write to urge you to provide the highest level of funding possible for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) in Fiscal Year (FY) 2027. We thank you for your previous support of this important program, including the \$20 million increase you provided last year and the inclusion of bill language requiring the timely allocation of funds to states.

LIHEAP is the main federal program that helps low-income households and seniors pay their energy bills, providing vital assistance during both the cold winter and hot summer months. Access to affordable home energy is a matter of health and safety for many low-income households, children, and seniors. LIHEAP assistance is an indispensable lifeline, helping to ensure that recipients do not have to choose between paying their energy bills and affording other necessities like food and medicine.

While we recognize the competing priorities you must balance, LIHEAP has become even more critical as demand for the program increases. According to the National Energy Assistance Directors' Association (NEADA), households are expected to spend 11% more on winter heating costs this winter compared to last year. In addition, NEADA reports that approximately one in six U.S. households is behind on utility bills, collectively owing about \$25 billion to electric and gas utilities.

Insufficient funding leaves states in the position of making tough choices about the amount of assistance they will provide and the number of people they will serve with the limited funding available. Ensuring that LIHEAP is well-funded will help guarantee that the program has the resources it needs to help as many eligible, low-income households and seniors as possible.

As you begin the work of crafting the FY 2027 Labor Health and Human Services, Education and Related Agencies appropriations bill, we urge you continue to your strong support

of vulnerable Americans by providing the highest funding level possible for LIHEAP. Thank you for your attention to and consideration of this request.


