## Who is eligible for public power utility membership?

All municipal, state, and other local, government-owned electric utilities in the U.S., its territories and possessions are eligible for membership in this category.

## Dues

Dues are based on revenue and kWh sales figures and customer data provided by the Department of Energy, Energy Information Administration. The EIA compiles this data from Form EIA-861 completed annually by all electric utilities.

New members enjoy a graduated discount on their annual dues: Year 1 – 50% of calculated dues (or minimum annual dues of \$550); Year 2 – 40%; Year 3 – 30%; Year 4 – 20%; Year 5 – 10%; Year 6+ full dues  
Minimum dues \$600.
