#### **Good News**

- We're not all crazy
- Utility people are *surprisingly* similar to those everywhere
  - Reliability
  - Affordability
  - Sustainability





#### **Bad News**

- We're surrounded by a lot of crazy people!
- Actually, not "crazy" we could all say that about our hometown
- Majority of California:
  - Highly motivated to decarbonize the planet
  - Driver: Can see the climate changing year to year
  - Our leaders are in charge of statewide policy and taking action
  - Generally... Environmental issues prioritized over affordability





#### **You Benefit**

- Pioneer mentality
  - Go West!
- State of ideas
  - If it doesn't exist, California is eager to create it



- \$2.5 trillion economy (#5 in world)
  - 14% of the United States GDP
- Net migration 103,500 per year
- Housing 50-100% above national average
- Largest farm-state
  - Central Valley is U.S. bread basket
- Forbes: Cost of doing business
   12% above national average
  - #43 in business costs
  - #4 in economic climate

### **Energy Policy is Jobs Policy**

- Clean energy jobs drive the California Renewable Portfolio Standard (RPS)
  - 500,000 jobs in clean energy
    - 300,000 energy efficiency
    - 153,000 solar industry
    - 4,600 wind energy
      - Source: Advanced Energy Economy Institute: California Jobs Report, 2016
  - Strong unions fight for these jobs, and to expand them with higher RPS goals
- Coal jobs nationwide = 51,000







 CA has higher rates, but milder weather – in many areas

Central Valley very hot

Bills high – Affordability concerns growing

# **SB 100 – 100% Clean Energy by 2045**

 60% Renewable Portfolio Standard by 2030

No large hydro power

• 40% Carbon-Free power by 2030-2045

- Large Hydro bill silent, but probably
- New nuclear unlikely for CA, but perhaps small modular reactors if waste can be addressed
- Prediction: You will see this concept expand nationwide
  - Maybe not up to 100% but interest will grow
  - Balance with reliability & role of natural gas



## **SB 100 – 100% Clean Energy by 2045**

Opponents of change have always said higher levels of clean energy would be too expensive or a threat to reliability, and have always been wrong.

They will be wrong again.

#### **Electric Vehicles**


- If you are NOT investigating EVs, it's opportunity lost
- Electric vehicles will grow from 3 million to 125 million by 2030, International Energy Agency forecasts
  - Top way to decarbonize
  - Load growth
- Greatest hurdle
  - Charging Infrastructure
  - Chicken before egg





## **Distributed Energy Resources**


- Options growing for customers
  - (CA solar on every new house starting in 2020)
    - Community solar option
- Engage with customers Others are!
- "Your" customers?





## **Distributed Energy Resources**

- Reliability is still King
  - Differentiates DERs from being grid-connected
  - Batteries, Batteries
    - In CA, only 80% of the way there
    - Need spinning mass
- With variable renewables, already moving toward capacity-based rates
  - Already there on water





### **Talk About Price & Affordability**

- Public Power is Consumer-Owned
  - Balance price with investment, value & affordability
- Be the laboratory of innovation
  - We cannot stand still
  - If you're utility is not trying new things, question it
  - At least, join DEED,
     APPA's research program
